ibm and the holocaust is the stunning story of ibm s strategic alliance with nazi germany beginning in 1933 in the first weeks that hitler came to power and continuing well into world war ii as the third reich embarked upon its plan of conquest and genocide ibm and its subsidiaries helped create enabling technologies step by step from the identification and cataloging programs of the 1930s to the selections of the 1940s only after jews were identified a massive and complex task that hitler wanted done immediately could they be targeted for efficient asset confiscation ghettoization deportation enslaved labor and ultimately annihilation it was a cross tabulation and organizational challenge so monumental it called for a computer of course in the 1930s no computer existed but ibm s hollerith punch card technology did exist aided by the company s custom designed and constantly updated hollerith systems hitler was able to automate his persecution of the jews historians have always been amazed at the speed and accuracy with which the nazis were able to identify and locate european jewry until now the pieces of this puzzle have never been fully assembled the fact is ibm technology was used to organize nearly everything in germany and then nazi europe from the identification of the jews in censuses registrations and ancestral tracing programs to the running of railroads and organizing of concentration camp slave labor ibm and its german subsidiary custom designed complex solutions one by one anticipating the reich s needs they did not

merely sell the machines and walk away instead ibm leased these machines for high fees and became the solesource of the billions of punch cards hitler needed ibm and the holocaust takes you through the carefully crafted corporate collusion with the third reich as well as the structured deniability of oral agreements undated letters and the geneva intermediaries all undertaken as the newspapers blazed with accounts of persecution and destruction just as compelling is the human drama of one of our century s greatest minds ibm founder thomas watson who cooperated with the nazis for the sake of profit only with ibm s technologic assistance was hitler able to achieve the staggering numbers of the holocaust edwin black has now uncovered one of the last great mysteries of germany s war against the jews how did hitler get the names

esteemed legal scholar louis fisher chronicles the capture trial and punishment of eight german spies caught on american soil in 1942 and analyzes the use of military tribunals in this case to shield the government s chief investigators and sentencing decisions 6 of the 8 died in the electric chair from public scrutiny and possible criticism

the notorious concentration camp system was a central pillar of the third reich supporting the nazi war against political racial and social outsiders whilst also intimidating the population at large established during the first months of the nazi dictatorship in 1933 several million men women and children of many nationalities had been incarcerated in the camps by the end of the second world war at least two million lost their lives this comprehensive volume offers the first overview of the recent scholarship that has changed the way the camps are studied over the last two decades written by an international team of experts the book covers such topics as the earliest camps social life work and personnel in the camps the public face of the camps issues of gender and commemoration and the relationship between concentration camps and the final solution the book provides a comprehensive introduction to the current historiography of the camps highlighting the key conclusions that have been made commenting on continuing areas of debate and suggesting possible directions for future research

yet my little diary i don t want to die i still want to live eva heyman a thirteen year old jewish girl wrote these words in her last diary entry in the spring of 1944 soon after she was deported and murdered at auschwitz during the holocaust the nazis murdered more than one million people at auschwitz the largest of all the nazi camps auschwitz was both a death camp and a forced labor camp author james m deem

examines this place of unspeakable horror from the perspective of those who experienced it from the construction of the camp to its final days

focuses on the major nazi concentration camps as defined by heinrich himmler the concentration system as it evolved the actions reactions and feelings of the different groups of people involved in it and the many phases of the process of dehumanization destruction and death preface

james tent recounts how these men and women from all over germany and from all walks of life struggled to survive in an increasingly hostile society even as their jewish relatives were disappearing into the east it draws on extensive interviews with twenty survivors many of whom were teenagers when hitler came to power to show how half jews coped with conditions on a day to day basis and how the legacy of the hatred they suffered still lingers in their minds

auschwitz treblinka the very names of these nazi camps evoke unspeakable cruelty sobibör is less well known and this book discloses the horrors perpetrated there established in german occupied poland the camp at sobibör began its dreadful killing operation in may 1942 by october 1943 approximately 167 000 people had been murdered there sobibör is not well documented and were it not for an extraordinary revolt on 14 october 1943 we would know little about it on that day prisoners staged a remarkable uprising in which 300 men and women escaped the author identifies only forty seven who survived the war sent in june 1943 to sobibör where his wife and family were murdered jules schelvis has written the first book length fully documented account of the camp he details the creation of the killing centre its personnel the use of railways selections forced labour gas chambers escape attempts and the historic uprising in documenting this part of holocaust history this compelling and well researched account advances our knowledge and understanding of the nazi attempt to annihilate the european jews published in association with the united states holocaust memorial museum

could the allies have prevented the deaths of tens of thousands of holocaust victims inspired by a

conference held to mark the opening of the us holocaust memorial museum this book brings together the key contributions to this debate

the book begins with two chapters on the fate of the jews of piotrków and warsaw pp 1 53 followed by a general account of the destruction process and an alphabetical list of the ghettos and camps pp 89 381 contain an alphabetical listing of all the cities towns and villages in poland and territory now in the ussr which previously belonged to poland giving details of ghettos and labor camps established in the towns the number of jews in each place and their fate pp 399 413 contain a bibliography of works in polish german and english

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
